#### Tato

The course currently having the biggest impact on me and my understanding of Scripture is DM2's study of the book of Hebrews. The author of Hebrews makes an incredible case for the true definition and expression of faith by first exalting the person, work, and authority of Christ by comparing Him with the now fulfilled Mosaic Covanent and directing his audience's attention to what Jesus promised He'd do, and what He's currently doing on behalf of every believer (Heb. 2:5-9). The author goes a step farther and draws on the experiences and lives of many figures from scripture as practical demonstrations of what faith looks like in action. All of this together presents a faith that is substantial, and a faith that is practical (Heb. 11:1-3). What used to be to me a book of "high and mighty" doctrines, the book of Hebrews is now one of my favorite books in scripture for clearly showing to every believer the "how to" for serving and pleasing God: by faith (Heb. 11:6)."



### Winter Classes

It is hard to believe that we have completed all nine of our winter courses here at 3DTC. Each module provides students with curriculum, notes, and resources that can be used in evangelism and discipleship in the years to come. We are thankful for all that we have covered so far. During these modules our main teachers (Bret, Tony, and Cody) and guest teachers have encouraged, built up, and led the courses and discussions. Please read on for an overview of each module that has been covered since the past fall!



#### 1. The Gospel of John

(Guest Teacher: Pastor Mark Land, Alex Musser)

This course consisted of a verse-by-verse study and overview of Jesus Christ's public and private ministries as depicted in the Gospel of John. Students encountered a number of doctrinal topics that were studied and discussed at length. A comparison to the synoptic gospel accounts was presented. By the end of this course, students were able to have a strong understanding of the unique evangelistic emphasis in John's account and be equipped to teach through the book chronologically and thematically.



#### 2. Panorama of the New Testament

(Guests: Doug Wilcox, Pastor Kurt Obermeyer, Rob Armstrong)

This course consists of an overview of the book of Acts through Revelation and provides a thorough summary of each New Testament book based on its chronological inclusion. The book of Acts was studied verseby-verse, in unison with the epistles that were written chronologically as the narrative of church history unfolds. Each epistle studied also includes key observations and takeaways that enrich the theological understanding of each book. By the end of this course, students possessed a greater understanding of early church history and developed a contextual framework of the panoramic flow of the New Testament.



#### 3. Ephesians (Guest Teacher: Carlos Tellez, JT Beckman)

This course consists of a verse-by-verse study of the book of Ephesians, stressing the importance of Christian unity in light of the spiritual realities all believers now possess in Christ. The primary theme of the book of Ephesians is the positional and experiential truth of being "in Christ" — and the practical ramifications that has for the church and believers' personal lives. This theme was traced throughout the epistle as students studied Paul's examination of positional truth, the mystery of the church, and practical applications in believers' everyday relationships with others.

















#### 04.-05. Introductory Greek II (Guest Teacher: Jason Weaver)

This course provided two weeks of Koine Greek II using interactive language vocabulary, grammar, and literacy teaching methods. This course built on our previous Greek I course.

#### 06. 1 Corinthians (Guest Teacher: Pastor Mark Land)

This course consisted of a verse-by-verse study of the book of 1 Corinthians. A few years after the establishment of the church at Corinth, the apostle Paul heard troubling reports about the Corinthian congregation: The church was characterized by rampant carnality. The believers in Corinth were full of pride, engaging in petty divisions, pursuing sexual immorality, suing each other in pagan courts, and misunderstanding key Christian doctrines, just to name a few problems. Instead of the church influencing the culture, the culture had invaded the church. No doubt about it, this was a church in conflict. In chapters 1-6, Paul addressed the various problems in the church. In chapters 7-16, he responds to specific questions the congregation had, probably expressed to him via a prior letter or message. In doing so, Paul sought to restore the Corinthian church to the only correct foundation — Jesus Christ.

#### 8. Hebrews (Guest Teacher: David Howard, Joe Aguilar)

This course consisted of a verse-by-verse study of the Book of Hebrews, addressing important doctrines pertaining to Christology, soteriology, the Old and New Covenants, sanctification, and faith-living. Throughout the letter, there are five warning passages against apostasy; each were analyzed and discussed in detail within the context of the book of Hebrews and the rest of the Scriptures. The epistle was written to Jewish believers who were experiencing internal and external crises that contributed to lingering doubts about the sufficiency of Christ in their spiritual lives. The author sought to address these doubts by emphasizing the supremacy of Christ above all else.

#### 9. Evangelism Training

This is a practical hands-on evangelism course. Students were carefully trained in the presentation of the gospel. They learned a simple, effective method of evangelism that can be used wherever they go in life. After practicing using this method in class, we had the opportunity to share the gospel with Beaumont Bible Church at the South East Texas State fair for a week and a half to over seven hundred people.


